A Gerber Replacement

Gerber is most often used as a jump over opener's natural notrump bid. These are the three main cases:

- 1. Over a 1 NT opening, responder can set a long minor suit as trump. Then the partnership has crosswood to ask for keycards.
- 2. Over a 2 NT opening, responder can bid 3 ♠, requiring opener to bid 3 NT. Four of a minor is then crosswood for the other minor.
- 3. Over opener's jump rebid of 2 NT, option (b) of Wolff with 3 ♦ checkback replaces both Gerber and a natural slam try at 4 ♦ with a natural slam try in opener's minor, and crosswood for opener's minor.

The need for Gerber evaporates for any situation where we have agreed to play such a method. Over a 1 NT or 2 NT opening, we can replace Gerber with these quantitative bids:

The 4 ♠ minor-suit slam try is also replaced.
